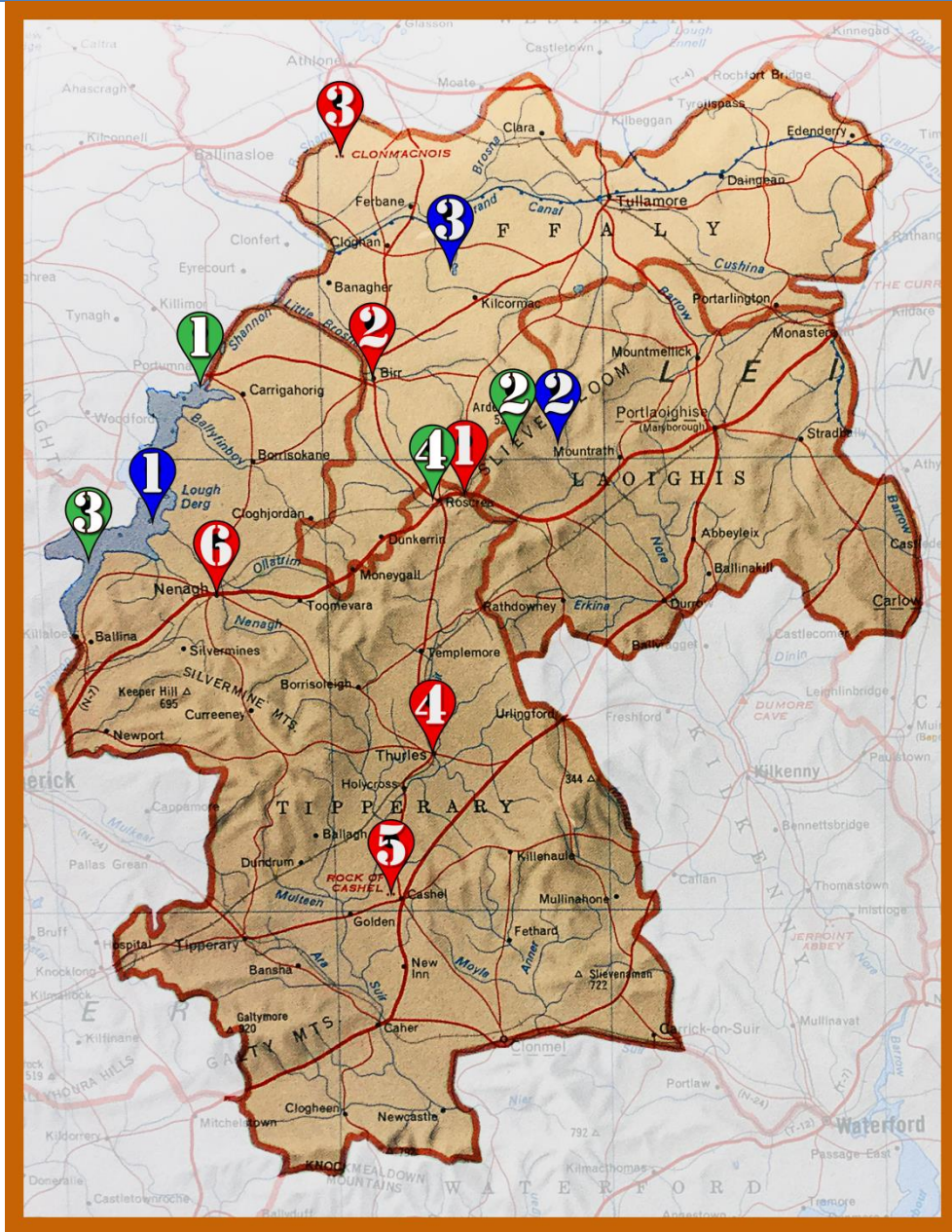














SEE & DO MAP
